## Bridge etiquette:

It is the normal understanding that if a player is partnering a less experienced player the junior partner's system should be played. This is especially important for new members who have just completed lessons and are now playing club sessions.

Yes, it is absolutely important that players should develop systems as their experience increases, but too much, too soon can be overwhelming. Our classes are taught as to NZ bridge guidelines which includes, for example, a 4 card major opening.

Also, if you are playing a 'newbie' pair and are playing systems that require alerts, please give full explanations that can be understood. For example, a 'pass or correct' explanation can mean everything or nothing to your opponents, and a fuller response should offered when necessary. And all players who are asking after an alert are entitled to a full explanation, and if the first one is not understood then ask again, and again! It is the responder's responsibility to give a full explanation, and not half the story.

(If alerted by the responder the explanation should be what the partnership agreed, and not prefaced by "I'm not sure but I think it means..."as this is giving information to your partner!)

Anyway, it's February and we're still able to play at the clubrooms, long may it continue!
