Name Badges

We have several new members and visitors to the Club so we have been asked to please wear our badges when playing.

Diamond Bust

Some members, when they are playing a short club consider a 1 Club opening as forcing for one round. Responder bids 1 Diamond with less than 5 points.

If this is your agreement it must be alerted.

Sometimes your partner will have a genuine Diamond suit with 6 plus points BUT the opposition should know that 1 Club is forcing and any bid by responder could be weaker than 6 points.
