

We have received many compliments for the day from visiting players, which is great for the club.

Other good news... we are gradually replacing all the cards in the bidding boxes as the existing ones were getting very shabby, especially the PASS cards. At present we have put out the initial sets, which slide wonderfully across the table! The rest will be replaced over the next few weeks.

Also the tables are being refurbished with new underlay, and new Forest Green cloths on top. Hopefully all will completed by the end of March.

## Fouled Boards and scoring.


A letter was received by the committee concerning this matter and after discussion, the decision made is that the director will make a decision as to % to be allocated at time of play, SKIP may be entered to allow continuance of play but score will be adjusted at the end of the session. Thus, SKIP will not show on final score but adjusted score will.

A couple of gentle reminders. Bidding cards MUST be left on the table until the FACED DOWN initial lead has been played. Also, the score must be agreed by all players BEFORE cards are tidied away. Please don't be too hasty in moving your cards as it can lead to unnecessary disagreements.

#### TIP FOR JUNIORS - BIDDING A SLAM

On Friday 7<sup>th</sup> Feb, Board 12, West was the <u>dealer</u> and the North-South pair had these cards:



- There was no bidding from either west or east. North opens with 1C.
- South's bid is 1D. South should NOT worry about showing their strength at this stage. The change of suit from 1C to 1D is always forcing. The most important thing for South to know is how strong partner is. Partner will tell you with their rebid:
- North's best rebid is 2H. This bid is one level higher than the minimum rebid of 1H, and thereby announces a hand that is 3 or more points higher than a minimum; generally 15 -18hcp.
- South, with a double stop in both spades and diamonds, now knows that, provided there are not two aces missing, 6NT will probably be the best contract. South now uses whichever ace asking method they are using to ensure that partner has at least two aces.
- · Partner does, so South bids 6NT.

In general, please remember this:

Holding all the aces and all the kings guarantees only 8 tricks in No Trumps. You need 4 more tricks to make a small slam.

Whether or not you have those is your job to find out by bidding carefully for the first two rounds of bidding.
