Charity Week

Survey results

Recently the question of time to start sessions was raised and a survey was put out for members' views. The result was overwhelmingly for the status quo, so times will stay the same.

Seating rights

As a club we do like to be as helpful and caring to our members as we can. Therefore, when seating rights are asked for a specific reason the director of the day usually accommodates. But we must be aware that this is a 'session by session concession' and that sometimes this becomes difficult when say, the last week of a competition requires a number of pairs to sit north south. In this instance the director's decision is final.

Phantom table

It has always been the tradition, in all clubs, not just Orewa that when there is a phantom table the person who enters the room last must sit at the phantom table for the first round.

This applies even when that person's partner has arrived earlier and may even have won the toss.

We have been a little slack on this recently, but after it has been brought to the committee's attention we agree it should be so.

Fouled Boards

The empty board should always be left in the middle of the table in a north/south direction while the hand is being played. This is to prevent cards being returned to the wrong pockets, which obviously affects play at the next table when the boards are moved on.

The Directors want members to know, that from now on, all four people at the table where a board has been fouled will be penalised. **The penalty will be that both pairs will get 45% on that board.** This does encourage all players to check the right cards are put back in the right pockets.

Players at the following table who discover the fouling after they have played the hand will not be penalised. They will be given a 'skipped' board result.
